

Re-enrolling in Education for Homeless Displaced Adolescents Highly Vulnerable to Trafficking and Unsafe Mobility

Every children has a right to education and enjoy the beauty of childhood, learn new things but it is a disappointment that many children are unable to enjoy it due to various issues like poverty, lack of awareness, lack of education, unavailability of resources, religious conflict, etc. Traffickers often take advantage of these problems and prey on vulnerable girls and boys from displaced areas who do not have social and financial support and who are hoping for a better life. Taking into mind of preventing those vulnerable children from such form of vulnerability comprising unsafe mobility for searching unskilled jobs, forced prostitution and preventing dropout rates, NEDAN Foundation has identified through home visits, rescued survivors from Childline 1098 and various information. Since Assam Government is giving free admission for all the BPL and APL students NEDAN Foundation has taken initiative of providing higher educational supports to girls and boys belonging from low financial background family and also those who were likely to be trafficked and dropped out from schools and colleges are re-enrolled in various educational institutes in and around Kokrajhar district, BTC Assam by distributing books as a token of encouragement and support. In this year on the occasion of one day residential program of “**Life Skills Training cum Career Guide and Counseling**” NEDAN has distributed books for the 79 students, consisting of 65 H.S students, 01 Vocational Student, 09 Science students, and 04 commerce students.
